Labour practices at Asian manufacturers and assemblers

Purpose: Stewart Investors would like to identify which Asian manufacturers are treating labour well and which poorly, how they are evolving and how their standards compare across the region.

Requirements:

- (a) Identify which companies have been very good or very poor at treating manufacturing staff.
- (b) Identify how this contrasts with how they treat their staff across the region (where applicable) and also the differences in treatment between contract and full-time staff.
- (c) Levels of scrutiny placed on labour standards at sub-contractors.
- (d) Highlight breaches of company-specific codes of conduct and/or where company codes breach local labour standards. Identify who is truly world-class (i.e. well above minimum standards).
- (e) Highlight the measures taken to mitigate risks related to large numbers of manufacturing headcount including role and execution of automation.
- (f) Identify who is best positioned and prepared as public scrutiny increases, standards improve and wages rise.

Detours to be avoided:

- (a) Descriptions of labour standards across the region, ILO ratifications etc.
- (b) Descriptions of high-profile breaches of human rights / labour standards (Foxconn, Rana Plaza etc.)
- (c) Box-ticking and/or databases on social policies
