Research Tender



Governance of four South East Asian Group Companies

Purpose: To identify signs of improving governance by examining any changes of stewardship and concomitant change sustainability positioning within four South East Asian Group Companies, including their listed and unlisted subsidiaries.

Requirements:

- > Detail any changes in ownership, control structure, key personnel or corporate governance culture at the listed and unlisted subsidiaries of the conglomerate.
- > Identify and detail any concomitant changes in attitude to broader ESG/sustainability issues.

Detours to be avoided:

- > Repetition or regurgitation of the corporate's public statements (e.g. in their integrated or standalone sustainability/ESG reports) without evidence of action.
- > UN SDG mapping.
- > Carbon emission targets that are not scientifically evidenced.
- > A background on companies and their business

Scope:

- > Analyse the historic standards of corporate governance in the group, as defined by attitude to minority shareholders and broader stakeholders, reliance on political connections for business advantage, and willingness to compromise on best practice standards of governance.
- > Identify the direction of travel for corporate governance of the group over the last few years; we would like to know whether this is improving, deteriorating or static.
 - o What have been the last 3 governance issues with the group, when did these occur, and how egregious were they?
 - o Has the approach of the controlling shareholders changed since then? Evidence of this evolution is important.
 - o Has there been personnel changes within the controlling group that might have precipitated a change in governance standards?
 - o Have there been any concomitant changes in attitude to sustainability and ESG issues more broadly.
- > Study 'Rep Risk criticism' of each group and evidence positive change as a result of these criticisms. (We can provide RRR).
- Identify any areas of sustainability/ESG performance in which the group and its subsidiaries are either leaders or laggards. Relevant topics may include but not be limited to labour practices, plastic packaging, emission standards, etc.
